

**North Clackamas Education Foundation
2017 Scholarships and Guidelines**

Clackamas Education Foundation (NCEF) provides scholarships to graduating high school seniors to continue their education at a college/university or accredited career school of their choosing.

NCEF will accept scholarship applications from graduating seniors who meet the following guidelines:

- ❖ Grade point average **2.5 or higher**
- ❖ Attending an accredited regional college or career school unless otherwise specified
- ❖ Scholarship will be used within one year of graduating
- ❖ Preference is given to students:
 - ❖ With financial need or other challenging circumstances
 - ❖ First generation college students (those who do not have a parent with a 4-year college degree)

NCEF offers the following scholarships:

Bridges to Success scholarships (\$1000 - \$1500) are awarded to seniors demonstrating financial need as well as first generation students (those who do not have a parent with a 4-year college degree) or those experiencing other challenging circumstances. Students will be selected based on need, service to their community or family and their career goals through written essay and counselor recommendations.

- Application instructions: Complete and submit the NCEF application.

Joe Krumm Memorial Scholarship is a one-time scholarship of \$1000 to \$2000 aimed to reduce financial barriers for students identified with specific learning and/or communication needs who also may be participants in NCS D music programs or are members of under-represented groups in post-secondary education.

- Complete and submit the above application and additional application materials available on our website or through your counselor

Judith Ann Hill Chemistry Scholarship is a 4-year scholarship pegged to the cost of tuition for a Milwaukie High School (MHS) woman student to major in chemistry at a 4-year college or university

- Complete the above application and additional application materials available through your counselor

Judith Ann Hill STEM Scholarship is 2-year scholarship of \$2500/year for a MHS woman student to major in STEM at a 4-year college or university

- Complete the above application and additional application materials available through your counselor

Nancy Matich Literary Scholarship is a one-time award of \$3000 for a MHS student demonstrating a love for the literary arts

- Complete the above application and additional application materials available through your counselor

Josh Critchett Memorial Scholarship is awarded to a Clackamas High School (CHS) student based on financial need, leadership, honors and awards, activity participation and work and/or volunteer

experience.

- Apply through CHS

Bapubhai B. Patel & Joseph A. Krumm Memorial Scholarship in Broadcasting & Social Media is a one-time award for a student in the Sabin-Schellenberg Professional Technical Center's Broadcasting & Social Media Program in recognition of their ability to connect the role media communications plays in bringing together a community.

Sabin Schellenberg Technical Scholarship is awarded based on financial need, college and career goals, and academic/technical merit.

Deadline

Scholarship applications are due on April 17, 2017 unless otherwise specified. Other deadlines may apply to the Josh Critchett (CHS) and Sabin-Schellenberg scholarships.

Award Procedures

Scholarships will be presented at high school awards assemblies for seniors.

Unused funds, if any, shall be returned to NCEF.

Payment of scholarship funds will go directly to the educational institution in which the student has enrolled and will not be awarded until the student submits the name/address of the school's financial aid office at which they have enrolled and registered; and their student identification number.

Scholarship recipients will notify the Foundation if they change schools.

We encourage the students to update the Foundation regarding their academic progress and to participate, if invited, in Foundation activities and events to ensure future funding for this program.
